Wednesday 20 September

THE MARY ROSE AND BOAT TRIP ROUND THE HARBOUR



Everyone should take the chance to see the *Mary Rose*, King Henry VIII's mighty flagship which sank nearly 500 years ago. Now she has been brought to the surface and painstakingly restored inch by inch by specialists with the aid of modern technology and research. A specially designed modern building enables you to

view every aspect of the ship and the artefacts that sank with her: a time capsule of seafaring life in the 16th century that is truly atmospheric.

The afternoon is reserved for the *Mary Rose* visit and we are lucky to have a complimentary boat trip round the harbour included in the ticket.

However, leaving early in the morning will allow you time to make your own plans before the afternoon visit. There are museums on various aspects of the British Navy and the old town itself is interesting. If you would like a birds' eye view of Portsmouth, you could visit the Spinnaker observation tower (£9.50 at the gate). Alternatively, you could take a therapeutic walk round the Hot Walls, once an artillery barracks, but now transformed into a vibrant new Artists Quarter where you can wander in and out of studios and maybe visit the brasserie or café.

Lunch can be bought in the vicinity, or take sandwiches if you prefer. Bear in mind that there may be cobblestones on the quay, so please come suitably shod.

We expect to leave Portsmouth at 4.30pm. This promises to be an exciting day.

MAIL RAIL, THE PEOPLE'S POST



For our November visit, we thought we would seek out an out-of-the-ordinary venue, especially for those members who have been to the more usual destinations.

The story of the postal service is a fascinating one. The day starts at St Paul's, where we will meet our Blue Badge guide and be able to have a bite to eat.

Our guide will bring to life the history of the postal service by showing us some of the clues and signs used in order to deliver the mail to the right address before house numbers or postal codes were introduced. On our route will be mail coach stops and various City pubs, just as they were in Dickens's time. We will hear how stamps were introduced and how the recipient – not the sender – had to pay the cost of postage.

Finally, we will visit the state-of-the-art Postal Museum and take a short ride on the mail train, which run on its own track under London. At the museum we will take in the story of the postal service spanning five centuries. I am sure that this will be a really interesting day out and no doubt we will never take the postal service for granted again. We aim to leave London at 6.15pm.
